

Background



Use simple background designs

Light background in well lighted hall


Dark background in dark hall

Don't go for fancy designs

Avoid patterns and gradient back grounds





- It elevates style over substance





FONTS

- Standardize the font throughout
 - Choose same font for all the titles

Choose same font for all the body text



Font size

FONT SIZE ???

 Depends on the distance between the screen and the last row of students

 In a demonstration room – fonts size of 20 or above will be readable

In a lecture hall – fonts size of 28 or above will be needed

- Things contributing to its popularity
 - It is a convenient prop for poor speakers
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Font colour

Font colour ???

On a white or light background

Use black or blue for general text

For highlighting use red or green with bold

Font colour ???

On a black or dark background

- Use white for general text
- For highlighting use yellow with or without bold
- For highlighting NEVER use fluorescent colours

Spacing of lines

SLIDE LAYOUT

- Use point form, not complete sentences
- Avoid wordiness: key words only



Spacing

6 words per line

6 lines per slide
